

Round 3 – Due May 9, 2017

For the third round, you will again add four corner triangles to turn the center square on point again, so it is oriented the same direction as the original block was. The triangles can be a single fabric or you can piece them, add an applique, decorative stitches, etc.

To make the four corner triangles, **cut two 16" squares**. Subcut each one diagonally in half, to yield four corner triangles.

Sew them onto the corners with a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam: Sew two triangles to opposite sides of the center block. Align the center of the triangle with the center of the block sides. Press seam out toward the triangles.

Sew the remaining triangles to the other two sides; again press out toward the triangles.

This should be slightly oversized, so trim it down to square it up, making sure there is at least $\frac{1}{4}$ " of corner triangle fabric that extends beyond the four points of the center block. (You don't want to cut off any block points.) The final size with the corners added should be **about 30 $\frac{1}{2}$ " unfinished**. If you piece a triangle, you may want to piece the entire square, or piece the triangles separately with sides of 16"

Inside center square finished size = 21"


Inside center square unfinished size = 21 $\frac{1}{2}$ "

Outside square finished length – 30"

Outside square unfinished length – 30 $\frac{1}{2}$ "
