Just a note about the origin of the Mothertown Quilters name: Mothertown Quilters is named for our home - Lancaster. In 1731 Lancaster (then 110 square miles) was proposed as the Worcester County seat. Lancaster declined the proposal. In 1732 part of Lancaster broke away to become Harvard. As so other sections of Lancaster began to formed their own towns - Bolton, Leominster, Sterling, Berlin, Boylston, West Boylston and Clinton. After birthing 8 daughter towns Lancaster was reduced to 24 square miles and kept the title "Mothertown".

Rotary Cut/Machine Applique: Sue Pelland is returning, this time to show us how to use the techniques we learned in her first workshop a couple of years ago to make a quilt – the Hope Diamond pattern; this pattern uses the same Leaves Galore ruler we used in that workshop, so if you already have the ruler, that's great. There will be enough of us with the ruler to share, so if you don't have it, you won't have to buy one unless you want it. You don't have to have taken the previous workshop to do this one.
