

## String Quilting – Transforming Chaos Into Quilts

In this class I will help you organize your scraps and make them into blocks and quilts using foundation piecing. Uniform or wonky, quilts made from strings can be planned and elegant or fun and scrappy. They can be one element of a quilt design or the entire quilt. I will explore both in this class.

### Class Supply List:

- Approximately 60 foundation squares cut 6 ½” square from muslin or other thin light colored cotton fabric
- String scraps\* pressed and sorted by color. Divide each color into three size lengths (4”, 8”, 12” or longer)
- Sewing machine and usual sewing supplies (scissors, pins, neutral thread, etc.) Featherweight OK.
- Cutting mat 18 x 24 and rotary cutter
- Rulers 6x24, 6x12, 6 ½” square
- Iron and iron mat/board (I will have one there)
- Extension cord



\*Pictured here are string scraps sorted into three sizes. Strings can include leftover bindings, fabric trimmings, parts of yardage or fat quarters. Cut these into pieces 1 ½” to 2 ½” wide, any length.
